Main Street Times, LLC; Aaron Bornstein and Stuart Bornstein, Applicants; 319 Main Street, Hyannis, Map 327, Parcel 102 and 331 Main Street, Hyannis, Map 327, Parcel 106

Install Roof-mounted solar panels

Stuart Bornstein in attendance. Gives an explanation of the restoring of the Cape Cod Times Bldg. 22 apartments. Kept a lot of interior original, replaced the windows, previously approved by this Commission. Now would like to put solar panels. Cannot be seen from the street. New roof on the buildings. Not visual.

Cecelia Carey asks for description of the solar panels/materials.

Stuart Bornstein, made out of silica, they are green and approved panels, weighted down.

Betsy Young is there some technical specifications for these, maybe amend the application.

Stuart Bornstein replied there was a big packet submitted for this.

Betsy Young, what is meant by weighted down? How much wind?

Stuart Bornstein, they are almost flush with the roof. Won't penetrate or hurt the integrity of the roof. Can withstand up to 180 mile an hour winds. These aren't typical where anchored, these are completely flat as to not get the wind.

Jack Kay asks where the disconnects will be mounted on building and conduit. Parabit surrounding the bldg. Sunlight interfering, doesn't seem possible.

Stuart Bornstein replies the disconnects are in the back of the bldg., have their own meter base. Grey box.

Chair Cheryl Powell opens up public comment. None. Chair closes public comment.

Betsy Young would like applicant to resend the packet of technical information to be included with the packet.

Chair Cheryl Powell clarifies, slightly tilted, no more than 3 or 4 inches.

Stuart Bornstein, they lay flat, minimal 10 or 15 degrees at the most, wrap around of the roof.

Chair Cheryl Powell concerned about the weighted down material – directs to Jack Kay.

Jack Kay states usually an extension frame, clipped to – ballast system. Is it sand?

Stuart Bornstein replies yes, they will put a ballast system Experience with system. Thinks the material is sand. In sealed bags, he thinks clips onto the frame, weighs the panels down.

Jack Kay locked together?

Stuart Bornstein, yes. They have ballast to keep steady and together. Nothing is visible.

Jack Kay states they deteriorate after a 3 or 4 years. What kind of roof?

Stuart Bornstein replies these are made special. The industry has come out with and they work. Intermittently on the panels. No rays because underneath the panels. Rubber roof.

David Sorensen is confident that the manufacturer has made them properly/efficient. .

Elizabeth Jenkins from a technical position, observation that information be provided.

Stuart Bornstein reiterates that he did submit some 50 pages of information. The application did get delayed. This is not out of the ordinary to be approved. Project has been delayed. They are up to standards. Bldg. Dept is satisfied with them.

Chair Cheryl Powell agrees with Elizabeth Jenkins regarding needing information for the specifications.

Chair Cheryl Powell entertains a motion for the Findings, moved by David Sorensen to find the application for 319 and 331 Main Street to be compatible with the preservation and protection of the district, seconded by Betsy Young, Roll Call Vote:

Stuart Bornstein suggests that to have missing pages supplied and vote conditioned as such. They can get it to the Commissioner's as soon as possible.

David Sorensen asks if we could put it in to be made to get to us by time certain.

Discussion regarding materials needed. We should try to accommodate

Stuart Bornstein states the Bldg. Dept. got sometime in September and there was a huge delay from that time. We tried to get on the last Agenda. Since process started been all of 4 months. The first package came in from the installer to the Bldg. Dept.

Elizabeth Jenkins – the Bldg. Dept. has to make a decision within 30 days. Time frame in which to get an application in to the Commission. The installer may have not submitted for the Commission. This Commission is responsible for the exterior and how looks. Look for documentation of how look from public way.

Chair Cheryl Powell suggests that the picture received from Cecelia Carey be shown, for all to view. Exhibit A.

Stuart Bornstein explains/shows where top of the roof and where panels would be placed. Put new roof on as well and shingles, sit inside rim of bldg. walkways that go around the bldg. Sit on the rubber roof with rim around the bldg. Parabit hides everything.

Chair Cheryl Powell asks how far in?

Stuart Bornstein 3 feet all the way around, don't rise above the edge.

Betsy Young – ok if not seen from street, would like to see the original materials all included in the application. Make a condition.

Chair Chervl Powell also would like this and verification that not seen from the street.

Thanks to Cecelia Carey for the picture.

Stuart Bornstein will have missing application submitted by Friday.

Chair Cheryl Powell entertains a motion for the Findings, moved by David Sorensen to find the application for 319 & 331 Main Street to be compatible with the preservation and protection of the District, seconded by Betsy Young,

Chair Cheryl Powell entertains a motion for the Certificate of Appropriateness (COA), with a suggested condition, moved by Betsy Young to issue a COA for the application at 319 & 331 Main Street as described in submitted material and subject to condition that remainder of materials be submitted by Friday, Dec. 18, 2020, the Commission is finding that these solar panels cannot be seen from the street, seconded by Jack Kay,

Chair Cheryl Powell – aye - on the basis of the claim of more materials submitted and be submitted for the Commission. Hence requirements of application pages to be filled out as well.
